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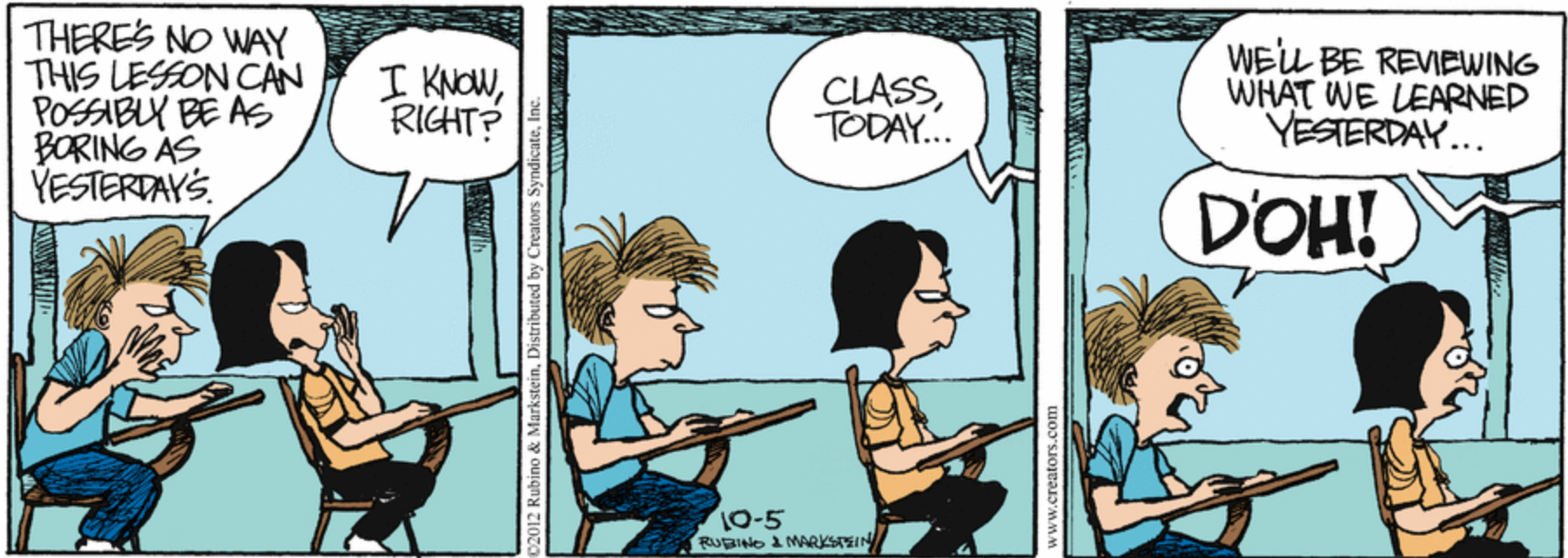

A tutor (of Latin tutor, 'guardian', 'protector') is in the academic field a person who is instructed with the guidance of others.

- Improved self esteem



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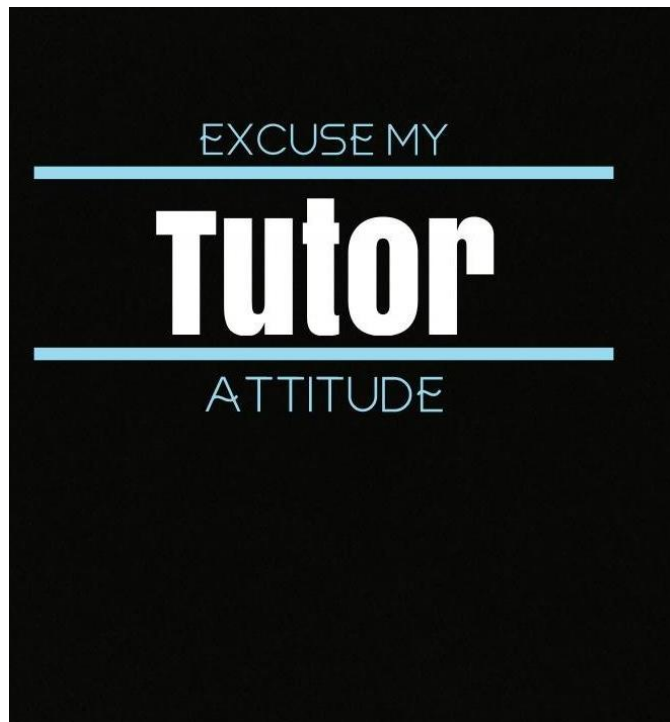

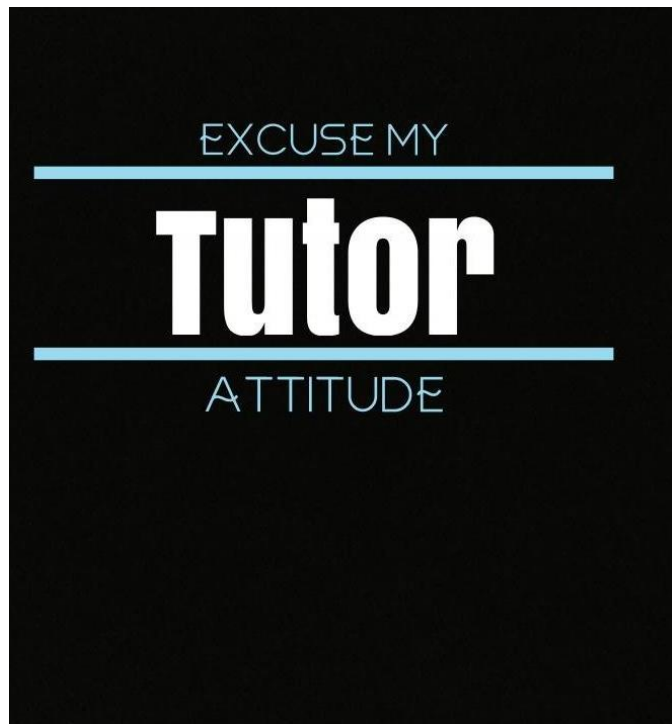
Group work: Instructions to act!

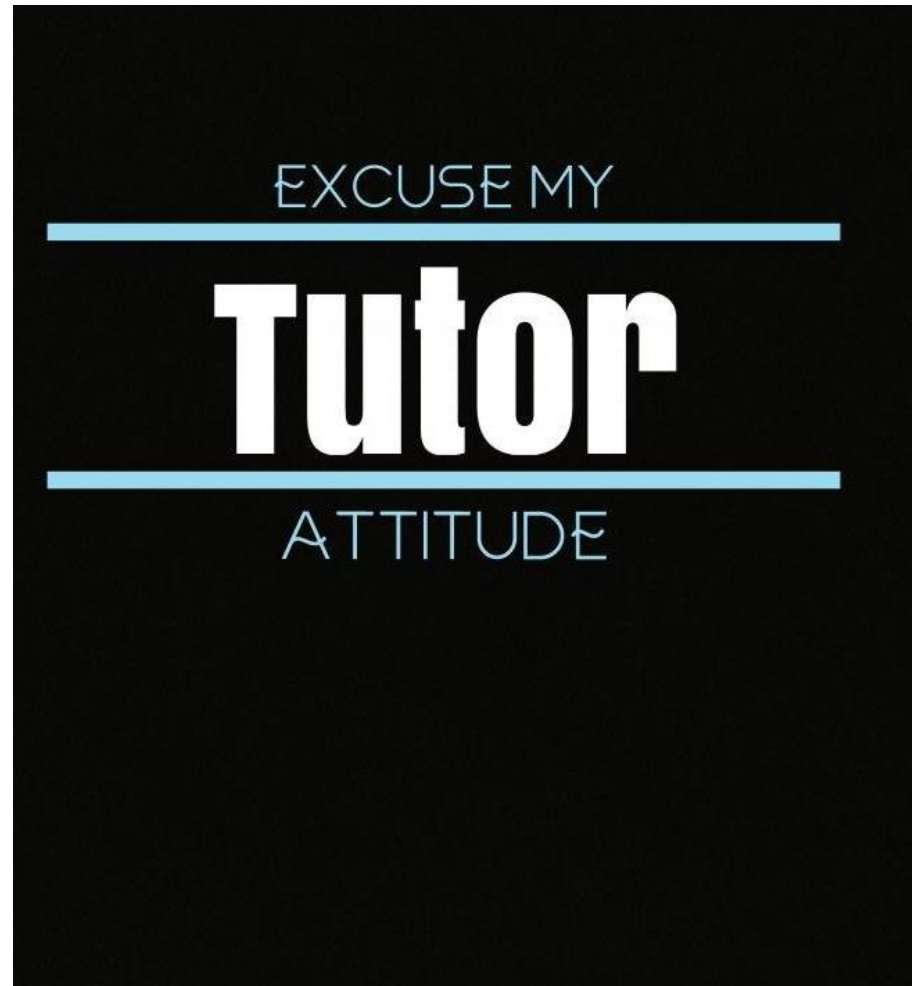
